In collaboration with Camino Wellbeing + Mental Health, this program offered homework help in math and English to students in grades 3-12. Students connected with tutors and enjoyed snacks as they worked through schoolwork. This program ran weekly on Mondays from 6:00-8:00 PM at The Family Centre.



Girls in Sports

This program, in collaboration with Focus on Ethnic Women (FEW), was designed for immigrant girls aged 12-16, and offered an incredible opportunity to develop skills, build confidence, and embrace the spirit of Canadian sports. Participants played volleyball, basketball, badminton, and more! This program ran on Thursdays from 6:00-8:00 PM at Kingsdale Community Centre.



Healing through Art for Kids and Parents offered space for the whole family to participate in mindful art projects and group healing. Youth practiced expressing their emotions through painting and crafts, while parents built community in a safe, creative atmosphere. This program ran on Tuesdays at 5:30-7:30 PM at Forest Heights Community Centre.

Rise and Play was a fun and energizing program designed for senior women. It was a great opportunity for women to stay active, socialize, and have fun in a supportive and uplifting environment. This program ran on Wednesdays from 7:00-9:00 PM at Kingsdale Community Centre.
